Savannah Thomas

Savannah Thomas is an 18-year-old senior at Southside High School. She has aspirations to enter either the USAF Academy or the US Naval Academy and work with Operations Safe, an organization that provides service opportunities to combat child trafficking. She was the President of Key Club, a member of the National Honor Society and Drama Club. Savannah participated in Mentor Day at Milton Middle School and shared with young girls the pressures and challenges of women in society. She told them women should not shy away from maledominated fields and jobs. She represented Southside High School twice in Mathematics at District Rally. Savannah is a Certified Fitness Coach who works with women in a male-dominated field. Her goal is to empower women to be their best selves. Her other activities include School of Rock Performance Group and Chorales Des Aims. Chorales Des Amis provides free performances at festivals and churches. They even performed at Carnegie Hall. She did all this while maintaining a 4.17 GPA.

Lafayette Woman Scholarship

The Lafayette Woman Scholarship is awarded to a non-traditional student, female head of household, and primary wage earner of the family. Applicants should be individuals pursuing post high school training or certification programs not necessarily requiring a baccalaureate degree. The recipient must use the scholarship to attend an educational institution that is accredited and normally maintains a regular faculty and curriculum and normally has a regularly enrolled body of students in attendance at the place where its education activities are regularly carried on. This scholarship can fund a certification program such as law enforcement or fire training education at a technical/trade school or a community college.


ULL Career Closet
